We're hosting a 24-Hour Prayer Vigil on Journey's campus starting Friday, May 8 at 6pm and ending Saturday, May 9 at 6pm. Each hour will have a person leading the focus on prayer, and you can come for an hour or stay for ten.

FAQs

What will be done with the \$100K savings each year realized from the solar?

Each year we go through a budget process that includes all the departments, our finance team, Ed (Lead Pastor) and Tic (Executive Pastor) and finally, the church board. Each year we say no to ministry opportunities that we would like to pursue but we are unable to because of lack of funds. Most likely the \$100K will go to those ministries.

Will the improvements be competitively bid?

Everything on the project list will go out to bid. However, in the past we have been able to experience amazing savings when someone from Journey offers themselves or their company to cover all or most of the cost on a project. Sometimes it is free labor other times it's labor & materials. They have made a HUGE difference! We're blessed.

Why doesn't Journey have a long-term capital budget strategy to handle these type of upgrades, rather than doing a capital campaign?

We do have a capital budget, and we use those capital funds to repair, replace and improve things on campus regularly. However, some of the big swings we want to take with ILTJ are just too much to add to our yearly ministry budget. Think of it like fixing your home – a lot can be done out of the monthly budget, but when it comes time to *really* renovate, it usually takes more. Same here.
